The Prayer of Thanksgiving and Intercession - April 16, 2006 Easter Sunday

Jesus was raised from death in a particular Jerusalem tomb on a particular April day. This is no fiction or figure of speech or figment of imagination. It's historical fact. Thank God. Let us pray.

God, our Father:

We thank You that the world's long night was over when the silence of that tomb and the stillness of that morning were broken by the laughter of a loving Father's heart. Our Father, how can we thank You for the love that crossed the chasm of sin and death to bring us back to You? Grant us such gratitude that we might adore You, giving voice to praise lived out in steadfast service to You and all in whom He comes to us each day.

Remind us that every Lord's Day is another Easter Sunday, so that we might begin every week of our lives with the joyful news: our Lord Christ is risen! Risen, indeed!

Hear our prayer as we pray the words our dear Savior taught us to pray, saying:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day, our daily bread.
