We pray for young Christians who have begun another year at colleges and universities. Guide them into all truth. Guard them from those who would try to destroy their faith in You. Give courage and wisdom to teachers, campus ministers and student leaders in Christian outreach. May these days of intellectual exploration and expression also be days of self-examination and days of discovery of the meanings that matter most.

Lord, give us all a deeper hunger and thirst for righteousness. Turn all our troubles into times for testing to transform us into the people You would have us to be. Instead of our complaining about difficulties, may we see in the challenges of this life, the lessons we need to learn for our growing into that life that's more abundant.

Thank You for answering our prayers according to Your wise and loving Heart as we pray the words we were taught to pray saying:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day, our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever. Amen.
